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in this bill that appeased the telemarketers represented by many people out behind the glass. It's something that we need to do. It's not a radical, Draconian measure. It doesn't require a whole pot full of tax money. In fact, if you look at the fining mechanism here, there's a potential, I suppose, for some income, some revenue, if people violate this. At \$2,500 a violation, there could be some revenue generated here till we break these people a lead that are breaking our statutes. It's interesting to me to see two competing factions in the back here, one of them actually wanting to tighten the bill up. Senator Beutler had a bill in committee, very tightly worded, constructed bill. We chose to go with one we could work with the lobby, the business, the telemarketers. We did that. We've kept our word. I'm going to continue to support the amendments. There are some cleanup amendments here of Senator Beutler's that we will accept. And I don't think there's any problem with them. But Senator Bourne's, for the life of me, I'm having a hard time figuring out where he's coming from on some of these things. The facts of the matter are, is the FTC has no jurisdiction over intrastate calls. They have adopted their rules and regulations. They've also exempted charitable nonprofits in the federal FTC rules and regulations. The only thing...so that's in place. The FCC is still taking comments on implementation of what they want to do. And they're considering, I stress "considering," intrastate calls being subject to what they do. So to bank on that and say, well, we'll see what happens, but the FCC...and I have dealt with the FCC in my business for years. You might as well hope the glaciers all melt, and so on, before the FCC gets to where they're going to have some rules and regulations, and so on. It's not...it could or could not happen. I'm not willing to wait. My point being, we've worked out this agreement with the telemarketers interested in this bill. The only question we had was the charitable organizations, nonprofits. And I'm willing to do some work on that. I have an amendment I think helps them a little bit here. But I would urge the body to support this amendment. As I said, we've worked it out. There's some things here with Senator Beutler we can accept. In the five years I've been on the Transportation Telecommunications Committee, we've had bills dealing with this all the time, every year. And Senator Beutler has been persistent. And I know that Senator Beutler wants
