handle these appeals after this bill becomes effective. There is some grant money that will be funding the Attorney General's Office in that endeavor. However, that grant...those grant funds aren't available at the beginning of the fiscal year. And so the DMV has some cash funds in the Automatic License Revocation Fund which they can transfer to the Attorney General's Office specifically for this purpose until that grant fund comes in. So that is the purpose of it. The A bill also has the emergency clause, so that they can begin this process immediately if the bill is passed and signed by the Governor. So that's the purpose of it. I would ask the body to support the amendment to the A bill.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bromm. You've heard the opening on AM2024, offered by Senator Bromm. Open for discussion. Seeing none, Senator Bromm waives the opportunity to close.
