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LB 17, 172

I'll just conclude my opening with those remarks. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Foley. You've heard the opening on LB 172. Mr. Speaker...or, Mr. Clerk, rather.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Erdman would ask unanimous consent to bracket LB 172 until January 1 of 2004.

SENATOR CUDABACK: You've heard the motion, stated by the Clerk. Any objection? So ordered. It is bracketed till 1-1-04. We now go to...as the Speaker stated, LB 270 goes behind LB 721. We now go to Select File, LB 17, 2003 senator priority bills.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 17 on Select File. Senator Mossey, I have Enrollment and Review amendments. (AM7148, Legislative Journal page 1980.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Mossey, for a motion.

SENATOR MOSSEY: Mr. President, I move the adoption of E & R amendments to LB 17.

SENATOR CUDABACK: You've heard the motion by Senator Mossey to adopt the E & R amendments. All in favor of that motion say aye. Opposed nay. They are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Synowiecki would move to amend. (AM2056, Legislative Journal page 2012.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator...Senator Brashear, I understand you're authorized to handle the Synowiecki amendment, AM2056. You may open on such amendment.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Yes, Mr. President, only until Senator Synowiecki is present, if he is. Senator Synowiecki raised this issue on General File discussion. Senator Hartnett and I both agreed that it would be an acceptable and even desirable change, and all Senator Synowiecki is doing is making it possible for individuals who are incarcerated in the circumstances set forth in the statute to have outpatient or inpatient treatment at
