to death for their views, as has the church of which Senator Foley is a member. Homosexuals have never racked anybody, put them on the wheel and stretched them mercilessly because they had the audacity to say that the earth is not the center of the solar system but that it moves around the sun. But Senator Foley's church did that. So why doesn't he take out religion? Because religion can be shown to have a very bloody, violent, brutal, barbaric history. But he doesn't want to touch his church and say, take out religion; don't make them a separate protected class. Why, there are more Catholics in this country than any other individual religion. There are more Catholics in Nebraska than any other religion, so why do we have to protect Catholics. How does anybody know they're Catholic unless they say it? So I'm drawing an analogy and a parallel to show you the bigotry that's on this floor, and Senator Foley is the poster boy for it. He is the one, when I talked about these priests not able to keep their hands off little boys, said that what I said was hateful; didn't think I should be in the Legislature probably. And then when the evidence started rolling in and it went not just to priests but bishops and archbishops and cardinals, he suddenly got quiet. So if we want to talk about bigotry on the floor, let's talk about it, and he is the poster boy. I said it and I said it in front of him, and he's got time to take issue with it. But I know that he was opposed to Senator Aguilar's bill that dealt with the drug court because we felt that there should be no discrimination in making that available to somebody in disregard of their sexual orientation. But because we wanted to say that the drug court opportunity should not discriminate against because of people based on their sexual orientation, Senator Foley opposed it. He thinks, apparently, that drug court opportunities should be denied people because of their sexual orientation. The right to employment can be denied based on sexual orientation. The right to procure housing can be denied based on sexual orientation. And protection from violence and murder should not be granted because of sexual orientation. That's what got him on his hobby horse, and what I'd like to see him do is deny it. And if he denies it, I will say...
