could get done. But when you've got people jerking your chain, you can't. You're not a free agent. You are not independent, and everybody learns pretty quickly who it is jerking your chain. Nature is not slow, as Ralph Waldo Emerson said, about dressing us in the livery of the kind of life we live and the things that we do. Mr. Speaker, I will withdraw that motion.

SPEAKER BROMM: The motion is withdrawn. We're back to the amendment, AM0317. Senator Foley, you have spoken three times on this amendment. There are no other lights. Senator Brashear, you're recognized to close on AM0317.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, you may not recall, but this is a relatively simple, straightforward, technical amendment that is onsistent with other amendments nearly identical to it that I've offered before and that have found favor with you. The committee amendment changes the terminology "county attorney" to "prosecuting attorney," as we have been doing it throughout other statutory schemes this session in order that there be no confusion about a prosecutor from the Attorney General's Office, or whomever, who has prosecutorial authority, with regard to a particular crime, being able to prosecute that crime. That is all that this amendment does and I urge you to adopt this amendment. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Brashear. You've heard the closing. The question then before us is the adoption of AM0317. All in favor please vote aye, and opposed nay. Please record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the committee amendments.

SPEAKER BROMM: The amendments are adopted. Mr. Clerk, do you have items for the record?

CLERK: I do, Mr. President. Your Committee on Enrollment and Review reports they've examined and engrossed LB 608 and find the same correctly engrossed. Amendments to be printed: Senator Janssen to LB 461; and motions by Senator Brashear to LB 270. Mr. President, bills read on Final Reading this morning
