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teenagers say to me that they are impressed, which is even more important, it seems to me. Plus, I feel that it is our obligation if we're to accept tobacco settlement money that we stay with the understanding. The Governor and the Appropriations Committee have both supported this type of a program. The problem now is to get the proper funding. I support the amendment.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Kruse. Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President and members. I, too, would like to thank Senator Thompson. I was one of those absent when the vote was taken, and I will be voting yes and I hope that you all will do the same. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Senator Aguilar.

SENATOR AGUILAR: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members. I also would like to thank Senator Thompson for bringing this back. I was at a doctor's appointment that day we voted on this, and I'm happy to have the opportunity to vote in support of it this time. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Aguilar. Senator McDonald.

SENATOR McDONALD: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. I also rise in support of this amendment and I thank Nancy Thompson, Senator Thompson for bringing that back to us so we have that opportunity. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator McDonald. Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, I want to be of a different chorus. We have lots of programs out there that can't be funded and how much money do we get from the cigarette people right now? How much is in that big fund that...and Senator Jensen I think said last time somebody asked him off the record, we can't touch it. All the money goes. Some of this money is not being spent. I think it's just dumping on the same people. I'm not a smoker, never smoked in my life, but we still keep pounding again and again on the same
