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lid, except one, except one school that has...the constituents in that district and the members of that district decided to override, and go over the levy limit. They needed to. They understood that, what it was going to do with their taxes, went ahead, and approved it. Because they wanted to keep that school open. Now, we...the rest of the schools in my district, which are...there are only four more...are all under the \$1.00 levy lid. They are able to do that. And it doesn't make any sense for them to raise that, because they couldn't spend the money anyway. I'm very proud of the education system that the taxpayers in my district...what they do with their public schools. My hat is off to them. They work very hard. And you have to remember that those people on that board that are going to make...be making these decisions, are elected officials also. They are accountable. They are accountable to the people in that district. They are the ones that take the heat. We...it hasn't been that many years ago when you could levy whatever you needed in that district. And did that happen then? I don't think so. There were some cases that they had to go a little higher than other districts, because their valuation was...their tax base wasn't there. And as far as valuation goes on property, we bring that on ourselves. How many times haven't you heard someone who is in agriculture say, you know, that quarter is really going to fit well in my farm, so I'm going to be able to give a little bit more for that land, because it fits in. Well, there you go. That's what drives the cost and the valuation of that property up in those districts, is because of situations like that. And that's fine. And if you don't need that piece of land, then don't buy it. If it fits in and you think that it's going to be profitable for your operation, then you're going to have to pay the tax on it. And we...the same way with homes in the city. If you want to live in a modest home, live within your means, then live in a piece of property that you can afford to live in. Don't build a castle and then say, oh, this is nice, but oh, my taxes are high. It's the same situation with property. The local school boards have to...they are obliged to educate those children in that K-12 system. And as far as I'm concerned, the state of Nebraska and all the school districts we have...we probably have too many school districts...but I don't believe there's a one out there that doesn't have the kids' well-being on their minds, and trying to
