category on the agenda that says, Final Reading, motions to return to Select File for specific amendment. We would plug in motions at that point on the agenda, if there are bills that you wish to amend. And that would be the case also with bills that are on Final Reading that aren't on the agenda. And there would be some of those that would be read Friday that aren't perhaps on the agenda. And if there are bills you propose to amend, you need to bring us the motions as soon as possible, certainly before we hit Final Reading, motions to return, on the agenda today. Keep in mind, the Governor has agreed to return all bills to us that we read by Thursday and which he intends to veto. And that will give us an opportunity to override the veto, if the body wishes to do so. And he's also agreed to try to do that for bills read on Friday, but he's not guaranteed to do so. I will attempt to give him the best list that I can tomorrow of the bills that will be read on Friday, so that he can review those and have an opportunity even before they're read to give them some examination, so that he can get them back to us, if at all possible. But we're not guaranteed that he will, for those that are read on Friday. I would encourage you to carefully review and consider your motions to return bills from Final Reading for amendments. And I encourage you only to file motions for amendments that you think are absolutely necessary, which I know we all believe they are, but would just ask you to really consider those carefully. So that's it, Mr. President. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Speaker Bromm, for the briefing. We appreciate it. Next agenda item, motion to withdraw. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Schimek would move to withdraw LR 132.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Schimek, to open on your motion.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President. I would respectfully ask permission to withdraw this resolution. It is very similar to another resolution that I introduced, and it was just an inadvertent double introduction. And I have to tell you the truth, staff was gone that day, and (laugh) they weren't
