SPEAKER BROMM: What...?

SENATOR BEUTLER: And if, in a year or two, we need to look at it again, we will look at it again, in the Appropriations Committee and on the floor of the Legislature. But this can be done without additional expense. It is the desire of all the people involved in it to do it without additional expense. And that's the way it's...that's the way the bill is designed.

SPEAKER BROMM: Here's the question I'm being asked, though, and I'm going to forward it on to you.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SPEAKER BROMM: This contemplates and envisions a Capitol administrator position. It would be a paid position. And I assume that that would not be a \$30,000 job. I don't know what it would be, but I assume that it would be something higher than that. Where is that money supposed to come from? And what position is supposed to be eliminated in order to...because we don't have such a position now. Or do you envision that there's somebody in DAS that simply moves from their duties now, whatever those are, over to assume these duties? I'm interested in...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Sure.

SPEAKER BROMM: ...the answer to that, because I think that's a valid question.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, I think it is a valid question. And that's a \$60,000 question, not a \$230,000 question, anyway, in any event. But that particular expense...remember, first of all, that \$3 million, over \$3 million of administrative program is being shifted. So that means that somebody over in DAS has a bunch of programs that they no longer need to administer. The newly created Capitol position probably would be in the area of \$60,000. And it is intended that that money would come from a reallocation within the \$3.3 million or so that is divided out to the Capitol administrator. Now, you know, I can get...the
