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Building, both in terms of human resources and materiel and program resources, and to simply divide that out. So certain personnel, certain people, certain programs, certain control over material will be shifted over to this new office. And the intent is to do that simply by splitting out that portion, fairly determined as best the Fiscal Office and DAS could do it. All that's left then are the questions that were legitimately raised by Senator Wehrbein and the Speaker.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Well, my only point was usually when you have an administrator, he has to have some support staff. So it would be more than \$60,000 if...along with benefits, would be my guess. And I guess my question is around the fact that would you then be eliminating somebody from DAS, or move them over to another area?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator, that's...

SENATOR VRTISKA: Or do you know?

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...a level of detail that...I mean, we're splitting out, you know, dozens and dozens of different things. And there are going to have to be discussions between DAS and the new administrator, and they're going to have to go through it detail by detail. And I'm not sure I can answer that question for you right now.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay. Well, that's the only concern I had, to make sure that...and when Senator Wehrbein put up his amendment, I understood why, because of the fact that there are those unknown costs that we don't maybe anticipate when we start on a new program.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yeah.

SENATOR VRTISKA: But you're...and I guess at this point, although I'm not sure...and I'm sure you're not either sure exactly what's happening. But I guess we move ahead on faith. Thank you.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Thank you, Senator.
