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representing such interests shall nominate individuals for membership." That language is too wide-open and vague, so on line 21, after the word "shall," we would insert the word "each." That would mean that each of these entities shall nominate. Then we strike the word "individuals" in line 22 and insert the two words "one person." Then this is how the language would read in lines 21 and 22: Entities representing such interests shall each nominate one person for membership. And that makes it clear that these entities that are discussed in the lines immediately preceding this language will each be able to send one member to the commission. When this matter was discussed at an earlier time on the floor, some of the senators who attended that meeting mentioned how it transpired. And I will not go into detail because they can speak for themselves if they choose to. But I have maintained down through the years that the Legislature, as an institution, must insist on respect and consideration based on what it is we do as an institution. We enact laws. We formulate policy. Today we will put on the fast track proposed legislation that will become a law that will reinstate a policy. Let me tell you why I think there is some juice behind this effort. A Democrat, who is in the U.S. Senate, provided the necessary vote by bolting his party to give the President a tax cut that he wanted. With this Democrat's vote, the Senate was split 50 votes to 50, if I read the newspaper correctly. A gentleman came out of hiding from an undisclosed location, many people thought he had expired, and cast the deciding vote, Vice President Cheney. The Vice President is the Chairperson or the President of the Senate, and in cases of ties is enabled and allowed and authorized under the U.S. Constitution to cast the deciding vote. People don't discuss this, but whatever state the Vice President hails from is given in effect three votes in the U.S. Senate. Every state has two senators which constitute two votes. The Vice President gives that state, from which he hails or she, if we ever have a female Vice President, a third vote. In addition to that, this U.S. Senator has contacted the U.S. Department of Agriculture on behalf of the effort that is being put forth here to make it clear that these types of operations should be supported, given assistance at the federal level. And we all know that politicians at no level do things based strictly on altruism. For my "quid" that I offer, I expect to receive that "pro quo."
