SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator, Senator Chambers, you may respond, if you care to.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. Senator Quandahl, on May 15 I offered this idea on a bill of Senator Bromm's that dealt with the zoning, but I withdrew it because he didn't want this to get involved with that bill. So it was actually offered as an amendment on May 15. It was discussed and then withdrawn. So it was before us some time ago and the body was well aware of it. And I even pointed out that I wanted to give notice of what was coming. I didn't want it to come up too late. So today is not the first day that it's been before us.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I would give Senator Quandahl the rest of his time, in case he had something else.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Quandahl, it's about one minute.

SENATOR QUANDAHL: I guess I would follow up a little bit with that. When I looked at AM2081, it appears to deal primarily with the selection process of appointments to the Rural Development Commission. But I was under the impression or actually in looking at the amendments to LB 754, that appears to deal primarily or exclusively, if I'm looking at this correctly, with just the funding mechanisms of the Rural Development Commission. Could you...I guess I will give you the rest of my time to comment on that.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Twenty seconds.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: It dealt with also reviving the commission. There was language in that amendment that said we revived the commission and that same language is in this amendment today and expands what the commission would consist of.
