SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bromm, did you wish to?

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Okay, thank you. I've been trying to get some information this morning from my rural development departments in my area. The comments that I've been getting are that those economic development districts are utilizing that for information from that commission. But I am not totally...have enough information to see whether, you know, it's of a value to keep that or it isn't. So I'm probably not going to vote on this bill just for the fact that I do not have enough information to make a decision. I don't like to see so many boards and organizations each doing the same projects. I just think it's a lot of duplication and I think if we had one, the economic development district, which we have a very successful one in northeast Nebraska, and possibly with just that issue, I think it could be handled. So those are my comments, and I'll return the balance of my time to the Chair. Thank you.
