was essential. I was absolutely necessary because I know things. I study things. And I don't just get things in my head. I act on those things. SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...that purports to do something and I know good and well it doesn't, I will let those whose job it is to oversee those sheep perform the role of the good shepherd, and we will see whether they are good shepherds or mere hirelings. Mr. President, I will ask for a roll call vote, but I want a call of the house first.

SENATOR CUDABACK: There has been a request for a call of the house. All in favor of the house going under call vote aye, those opposed nay. Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to place the house under call.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The house is under call. All unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Unexcused senators report to the Chamber. The house is under call. Senator Jensen, would you check in, please? Senator Janssen. Senator Price, would you check in, please? Thank you. Senator Maxwell. Senator Beutler. Senator Cunningham. The house is under call.
