SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR LANDIS: ...by the way, will be injured. They will be hurt, the 12 percent who won't get the sales tax money. We're going to give all the money back, including the money for, as Senator Mines described it, Omaha, Lincoln, and the first class cities, which he self described as saying, they can weather this storm; they've got new sales tax. We wanted to solved this problem, we could do it with \$300,000, not \$3.3 million. If we were really after trying to solve that problem, we could do that. We could do it pretty easily. We could do it this year; we could do it next year. But the sum total here is saying, you know, because we've got...and there are many of these small communities. But when you add all up their population, they're 12 percent of the municipal population. They will be prejudiced by this cut that we've made. On the other hand, in the greater scheme of things, the cut is fair. And the remedy that's being proposed here, which is to simply undo this thing, puts money...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR LANDIS: ...in the pockets of people who do not need it because we've created greater resources for them. You want a rifle shot solution? Authorize 300,000 bucks,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: ...and distribute it per capita to cities who don't get sales tax, and it will go to exactly the...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: ...12 percent of the population who are in cities...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Landis, I'm sorry.

SENATOR LANDIS: ...without sales taxes. Thank you.
