SPEAKER BROMM PRESIDING

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Next is coming to you a floor exhibit which shows you the unique boundary line configuration of Nebraska and Iowa as it relates to Omaha and Carter Lake, Iowa. And third, I am circulating to you a copy of a bill. It's on green paper, so you wouldn't want to confuse it with one of ours. It's in the...it's pending in the Iowa Senate. It was introduced by the president of the Iowa Senate. It's pending on what I will call a priority calendar where it can be brought forward at any time at the behest of the majority leader of the Iowa Senate.

SPEAKER BROMM: Time. Thank you, Senator Brashear. Senator Brashear, you may continue, I'm sorry. Your light is next.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: And the...what the Iowa bill provides is that, if the bill were to pass in the Senate and then pass in the House, and I'll be happy to discuss with anybody later, I know people are being told this is not what it appears to be but I thought maybe you ought to read it for yourself and we ought to make our own decision, what we all can know by reading that bill is if you look at the floor exhibit entitled "Potential Impact of Changes in Iowa Gambling," I will tell you that a fair reading of the Iowa bill that has been distributed to you leads you to believe that, first of all, if you look at the left hand of the potential impact exhibit, you see how our boundary lines up between Iowa and Nebraska. Few people really grasp this, that there is a portion of...a large portion of Iowa which is on the, quote, Nebraska side of the Missouri River. If you then will look at the right-hand portion of the "Potential Impact" exhibit, what you'll see is the...that strip of land which would be eligible under the Iowa bill for the construction of a land-based casino, yes, a land-based casino, and we can, in questions or whatever, get to the specifics of the bill, but it
