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appreciate the dialogue and the opportunity to discuss the issue, but I...one of my primary concerns is the establishment of this Nebraska Future Trust Fund and in the state constitution. And I say this because of how we've been beat up by constituency groups over trust funds and how they're used, how they're established, how they're funded, and how the Legislature or the folks see the Legislature's hands being tied. But so far I'm not aware of other trust funds that exist in the constitution, but I have great reservation when the constitution locks in the exclusive spending of the proceeds by an appointed body, an exclusive. I mean on page 4, line 1 says, shall be appropriated exclusively to the Nebraska Trust Fund to be governed by this committee. Now they're appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Legislature, but I would believe that conventional wisdom would say that the authority by the Legislature would not be a great amount here. When we look at the issue, I mean it says, on the ballot language, are you...do you want six licensed casino structures, and then recognize the rights of Indian tribes relating to casino gambling? I'd like to know how many beyond six licensed casinos there would be and other issues. But when we hear about the numbers and gambling already in Nebraska because of keno, because of pickle cards, because of whatever other games there are, the lottery, yes, gambling we already do have in Nebraska, and I ask the question why do we want more when research shows that it would bring about a greater expense than the revenue it would generate? And when we look at charitable gaming, casino and others, you don't see the same impact on society as the slot machines, and I believe that this is what it is about with the advent of the slot machines. And I understand that Iowa has some pending legislation and there's pending legislation all over the country that I don't believe we should react to here in Nebraska. And it might have priority status, but even priority status here in Nebraska does not make it a sure thing. And I look...I look...I thought automatically because I have to say that Senator Brashear did get my attention when he pointed out that they could come into Abbott Drive in Omaha and still be in Iowa, and nothing we can do will prevent that. Say we did put something on the Nebraska side and Iowa wanted to compete more heavily than they already are. They'll do that. I think that's reality. I can't see us preventing Iowa from putting a casino.
