SENATOR CHAMBERS: A majority of the body.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: No, it takes 30.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And you feel 30.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: And we had 25. There were 25 without me being involved or cluttering up the process.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: There were 25 without you being involved.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: I'm trying to bring...I'm trying to find a narrow prescription that brings more people to a result that I think is rational and limiting.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Are you aware that I was 1 of the 25?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: I am aware of that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So you will take my place when I drop off and you're...you are assuming...

SENATOR BRASHEAR: I could never take your place if you dropped off.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, all we're talking about is the number of votes now.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Yes. All right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So you would still have 25 votes. They wouldn't lose anything. They might not gain anything except my opposition. But since you would probably have 30 if you adopt this, 30 can certainly overcome 1, isn't that true?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: That's true.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Are you sure? Under our rules, can 30 overcome 1?
