SENATOR BRASHEAR: That was the rationale.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: ...exclusion, was to have a lesser number of casinos Is that right?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Yes.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Okay. I know that, obviously from the picture of Carter Lake and the problems that we've had with those legal terms called accretion and avulsion, we ended up with a weird set of configuration for the Iowa-Nebraska border, but those borders do change from time to time based upon accretions. Isn't that correct?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Yes. However, this one is...this is established by an agreement of sorts.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Can you (inaudible)?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: That's why...that's why we have it in the first place. We are...the river changed and they didn't want the boundary to change.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: So how is that boundary line established for the two-mile zone?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Senator Pederson, I...the two-mile zone is established from the center of the river.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: So it's the center of the main channel of the river.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Yes.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: As currently surveyed, is that right, or...

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Yes.
