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minutes, Senator Bourne.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you, Mr. President and members. Actually, Senator Stuthman, if you would yield the time to Senator Jensen or Senator Byars, I think they are going to make a proposal here. I probably will still vote red on this, but they are going to make a commitment, so.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Stuthman, would you...

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Yes, I would yield my time to either...I will yield it to Senator Byars.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Byars.

SENATOR BYARS: Thank you, Senator Stuthman. Thank you, Senator Bourne, for your graciousness. I thought Senator Bourne was going to offer an amendment to increase this to \$3 million so we could actually have as much money as we needed, but I guess he's reluctant to do that. We have visited and Senator Jensen and myself...and if I have any time left I'll yield to Senator Jensen...have pledged if we can keep this program intact, if we can keep at least a skeletal staff educating kids, going into schools, going to civic groups, going into the public to try to educate about the true problems that develop from teenage smoking and adult smoking, we don't have to start over completely and we will make the pledge to revisit the tobacco money to see how there is a possible way that we can fund these programs. We think they're extremely important. And I will make that pledge personally and I'd yield my time to Senator Jensen to, I am sure, do the same.

SENATOR CUDABACK: It is Senator Stuthman's time. Senator Stuthman, would you yield to Senator Jensen?

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Yes, I will.
