SENATOR STUHR: Okay.

SENATOR STUHR: Right, and timing is very important. Thank you, and I do give the rest of my time to Senator Bromm.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Stuhr. I am sorry, Senator Bromm.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Stuhr. Thank you, Mr. President. Just very, very briefly, I rise to support the motion. I think it's a very worthwhile effort. It's not a great deal of money although all dollars are important at this point. But I think it's a good investment for us and to help. It's a one to three match really. There's be \$2 for every \$1 that we're able to put into the program, and I think...I appreciate what Senator Chambers said about trying to meet a need which was a demonstrated problem in Omaha with the lead problem, and I think this is a similar concern as far as the importance of trying to solve the problem.
