need to. So, thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Smith. Senator Bourne.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you, Mr. President. Am I giving an update, or is this on my time?

SENATOR CUDABACK: You can if you wish to.

SENATOR BOURNE: No, that's all right.

SENATOR CUDABACK: We'll give you 30 seconds for an update.

SENATOR BOURNE: Of where we're at. I could...well, where we're at is, is that clear back on General File, if you recall, I kind of brought to the body's attention that the federal government is establishing a do not call list. And I had expressed my thoughts that the bill wasn't necessary, because of the federal government's establishment of an anti...or, a do not call list. And so I filed this bracket motion on Select File to try to lay the bill over for a year, to see if the federal do not call list worked.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Now you may speak on your time, Senator Bourne.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you, Senator Cudaback, members. Again, to reiterate, I did talk on this bill on General File, if you recall. And I guess on one hand, I'm sorry that this is a...at this late of an hour that we're still discussing this. But I did file the bracket motion, because I think that the federal government is establishing this do not call list that will handle this problem. And I went through a number of reasons why we shouldn't adopt this big government bill. And I want to kind of go through those just a little bit further. I was on the Internet the other day, and I was looking at the Federal Trade Commission's web site, and they've got a Q and A, the FTC's changes to the telemarketing sales rules. And I just kind of want to go through these just a little bit to establish how the federal do not call list will work. So here's the questions. It says, how will the National Do Not Call Registry work? You
