that it eliminates the majority of calls. And while maybe there's still some intrastate calls, we've protected the industry in Nebraska. Say the government's plan works, the federal government's plan works. So then what do we have to do, if we do a delayed effective date? We have to come back in next year. We have to pass a bill in the short session. The bill would have to be prioritized, because you and I...we all know that...I don't know how many hundreds of bills there are on line. A bill that stops a program such as this, it won't pass. So again, I'm going to ask for your support on the bracket motion. I think that we need to just lay this bill over, take our time, see what the federal government's plan does. I think it will work. And again, there's been some thought expressed that the federal government surely won't do this. And that's not the case. Again, I've gotten orders handed down that Congress has ordered both the FTC and the FCC to implement these rules and regs. I think one...the FTC goes into effect July 1, and the FCC goes in October 1. So we will see what happens this summer, whether or not the federal rules and regs will be effective in reducing the number of these calls that, I agree with you, that the...our constituents are opposed to, or don't seem to like. But I think that we need to see if the federal rules and regs work, and at the same time protect our industries here in the state. Thank you.
