SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR BOURNE: ...of our economy, creating jobs, and I suggest that we're stifling it, and we're shutting it down, similar to what Senator Mines had indicated. I'm going to withdraw the motion, Mr. Speaker. And we'll see if there's support for the bill. And if there is, if we want to be duplicative, if we want to do what the federal...if we don't want to follow the federal government's lead, we want to expand our government, we want to go with "Big-Government Adrian," let's do that. So Senator,...or, excuse me, Mr. Speaker, I'll withdraw my bracket motion, and we'll continue the discussion on the bill.

SPEAKER BROMM: It is withdrawn. Members, with the withdrawal of the bracket motion, we are back on Senator Smith's amendment, AM1484, which had been opened on. But, Senator Smith, there are amendments to that amendment, but I'd certainly offer you the opportunity to explain your amendment briefly, if you would like to do so. SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Briefly, AM1484 becomes the bill. It is the amendment that will be amended by the exemption for charities. I think Senator Beutler is going to withdraw his amendments. There is the amendment AM2067 to delay the implementation date, the effective date. And then we'll be on our merry way. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Smith. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have have a series of amendments to the amendment. Senator Beutler, AM1566.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Clerk, Senator Smith has agreed to include a couple of amendments and one cleanup amendment, if you want to call it that, that he has later. And we're at a point now where we're either going to have some very limited bill to pass this year, or we're going to have no bill at all. And although these
