SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Janssen, Chairman of the Health and Human Services Committee (sic), you're recognized to open on your confirmation report.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. Members of the Legislature, the hearing was held yesterday, May 29. There are four appointments to the Advisory Commission on Compulsive Gambling. I will take them all four at the same time, if that is advisable, Mr. President. The first one was Francis McGill, a reappointment to the commission for a third term. He is from Omaha. He is a recovered compulsive gambler and is in the painting and restoration business. This is his third consecutive term. The second nomination was from Susan Parascand. She is a reappointment to the commission also. She is from Lincoln. She has served for many years on the commission and spoke with us regarding the goals of the commission, which was very interesting. She is in the real estate business. The third appointment was Mr. Wayne Choat. He is a new appointment to the commission. He lives in St. Edward, Nebraska, and is an applicant...application engineer manager with a company in Lindsay, Nebraska. The fourth new appointment, she is a new appointment to the commission, is Lynda McNulty. She lives in Omaha. She has a Ph.D. in administration curriculum and instruction. She is the vice president from Clarkson College in Omaha. We had a very interesting discussion, especially with the new applicants, and the ones who are up for reappointment. And I would hope that you look upon them with favor. They seem like very good candidates to the committee. With that, thank you.
