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Certainly, they are the ones that she is going to contact when she wants a pregnancy test. And, in fact, we have a handout here that shows us that, in fact, these people do disseminate judicial bypass information for minors. So this is the place that a young girl is going to go for help and they are going to tell her about our law and how it works. There is another place that she can get information and that certainly is from our statute books, and you would say, but young people don't know how to read statutes. Well, I will tell you that public libraries in this state have copies of our statutes. They have informed people who know how to read those statutes and help people get through them and find the information they need. We do have an Internet system. Students are very savvy. I will tell you that students are going to go to their peers who have been in the same situation. They are going to ask them what information they have, and if they trust their teachers or their counselors, they will then go to them and they will ask them for help and information. And in all of those places, this information is available without requiring the schools to give a form. Schools talk many times about unfunded mandates. I remember when I was on the school board the many, many things that we did; the trees that we cut down, the time that we spent, the staff time that we engaged in doing things that really had nothing to do with academic education. And so I support taking this responsibility away from the schools. The schools support the Foley bill and I think it's important to realize that we have very sophisticated teenagers and a number of avenues for them to get the information they need, and probably a more timely and effective manner than the schools disseminating that form.
