than any other sentence that I've found in the statute books. And rather than get off on that tangent, I'd like to ask Senator Foley a question or two along the lines of what he interrogated Senator Schimek about.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Foley, would you yield?

SENATOR FOLEY: Yes, I would.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Foley, and this is not going to be an attack approach, by the way. The text of Section 71-6909, which you want to repeal, is on your gadget in Senator Schimek's amendment. Do you have it showing on your gadget?

SENATOR FOLEY: I do.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If you start in line 17, what is the only thing that the school is actually required to do in order to comply with this statute if it chooses to take this alternative?

SENATOR FOLEY: I was just pulling it up on the screen, Senator. I think I understood your question. You're asking what's required of the schools?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, I will read the language: The State Department of Education shall develop and distribute to all public schools a standardized information form which may be used to comply with this section. Are you aware of any school formulating a paper other than this that has been provided by the State Department of Education?

SENATOR FOLEY: I believe that to be the case, Senator, although I'm not prepared to provide any evidence of that. I'm hearing anecdotal information about the schools using the discretion that's provided to them in providing various types of information.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But based on what is in the statute...

SENATOR FOLEY: Well, the statute says they may use that form. They don't have to use that.
