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and it's...up at the top it's handwritten in block letters, it says "Draft Adopted by School Board," and then those are my initials, PB, District #8. I didn't want anybody to think it was Senator Brown's. Maybe I will put my middle initial on there next time. But I wanted you just to see the form. When we talked about this, again in committee, nobody had the form, if I recall. Now this was last year. And to be honest with you before the hearing on this in the Education Committee, I didn't know that this was even done. I've never heard from a constituent complaining about this. I've never heard from an administrator complaining about this. And, quite honestly, to say that this is burdensome, it is a mandate, absolutely, and I tend to be opposed to mandates, but this, to me, is not burdensome whatsoever. But during the debate, we did not have a copy of this, as I recall. And I wanted...and I voted it out of committee. I did, but I think I've...I did vote it out of committee before I had a copy of this notice. And I will read through this, and I urge you to do so as well, and to me it's almost benign. I mean, I think the word "abortion" is mentioned three or four times. And, again, to a pro-life individual, like Senator Foley, I can see where something like this might be offensive, given taxpayer dollars are paying for this. But, again, this is the status of the law, not just in Nebraska, but in the United States. Every state has to have a...and Senator Chambers or Senator Foley can correct me if I'm wrong, but I believe every state in the Union has to have a mechanism for judicial bypass or parental waiver or whatever that is that simply indicates to the individual what a significant choice this is or what a significant event this is. And, again, I don't know, I don't know what I'm going to do, to be quite honest with you. I did vote it out of committee because it does seem kind of an unusual thing. I was kind of curious, do other states do this? Is this required by the federal government? Senator Schimek has done a great job of giving us the history of how this happened, how this came about. Again, to me this is fairly benign. I don't know what I'm going to do. I don't think this is the most important thing that we're going to debate all year. Quite honestly, I personally don't see this as an abortion issue. Senator Redfield, I did enjoy listening to your speech. You often have enlightening words. But I'll tell you, I never saw a statute book until I was in law school, and I
