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not have to give it word for word as it is on this document.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: And that's what I wanted to get into the record, Senator Redfield. This is a working draft, if you will, a model that can be given to school boards to select what they want from it. Now, it is my information that the Lincoln Public Schools System, for instance, only has a seven-line document that they give out, and I'm guessing that's this first little bit right up here where it explains about notification and waiver of notice. I'm guessing that's...and we're going to try to get that document. So Senator Bourne, did you want to respond to that?

SENATOR BOURNE: I do. And Senator Schimek, my understanding was this was kind of the form developed by the State Board of Education and pretty much universally used by the various districts. So if that's not quite accurate, I apologize. It was not intended to mislead; that was...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Oh no, you didn't...

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...mislead us, I don't think, Senator Bourne.

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I think each school district has the ability to develop it the way they want to.

SENATOR BOURNE: That's right. Absolutely.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Right.

SENATOR BOURNE: And again, you know, I've found it helpful--and I don't mean to take up your time--but I've found it helpful to have a copy of the form after the hearing, so that I knew exactly what it looked like.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Right.
