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SENATOR BOURNE: And that's kind of why I...several people talked about it, and that's why I gave it out to the members. I just wanted them to see exactly what we were talking about.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: And we appreciate it. Thank you, Senator.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: So I wanted everybody to know that this isn't necessarily what school boards are passing out. And I will try to get a copy of the Lincoln Public School document if we need it. But I'd also like to say that Senator Raikes makes a good point when he mentions that the statute specifically states that schools are not required to provide specific information regarding how students may implement the bypass provision, but they may. I mean, and that was true before we passed LB 425 back in 1991, and it's still true today, and it would still be true if we pass Senator Foley's bill. I agree with that. But that's...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...that misses the point. The point is that you want students to know ahead of time that this provision of law is out there. You want them to be concerned about perhaps making a wrong decision. I don't think that hurts. And at the point where they're really in trouble, yeah, they need to have that maybe reinforced. But at that point, it's too late to really have much consequence in terms of prevention. I'd also like to say to Senator Quandahl that I can't compare the rules of the road to having an abortion. I think they're such different,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...totally different issues that, you know, I'm...I don't know how you can compare them. I think this is something that is more intimate and...

SENATOR CUDABACK: I'm sorry, time is up, Senator Schimek.
