providing whatever information to the student that they think is most appropriate. This bill doesn't stop any of that. It's a simple bill. It just says you don't have to give out that piece of paper anymore. You don't have to. What if you want to? If you want to, you can. But it doesn't force you to give this out to all these kids. One hundred and thirty-three thousand kids every year get this. The transcript of the public hearing on the bill shows very clearly that the committee did have access to this form. They did, because Senator Bourne asked for it on the public record, and he was given it, and he thanked the person for it. Senator Bourne passed out a form. That's not "the" form. It's the form that he found in Omaha. It's not the form that's used in Lincoln, and it's probably not the form that's used in Scottsbluff, because we never told the schools that they had to use any particular form. He's found one form, not "the" form. I again ask you to look at the section of revised statute I distributed to you, Section 28-325, which says it's the expression of the will of the people of Nebraska and the members of the Legislature to provide protection for the life of the unborn child whenever possible. Senator Chambers says that language is ill-considered, highly emotional, full of silliness. He didn't tell you that he voted, yes, on that language 25 years ago. No other state, no other state places this kind of a burden on its public school personnel. Michigan tried it ten years ago, and they got rid of it within two years. Overwhelming vote out of the Michigan state legislature, get rid of this, we don't need to do this. Supreme Court never forced this on us; this was a Nebraska invention, and we're all alone here doing this. We're all alone. No other state does this. This is a burden on the schools. They've told us that time and time again. We need to take this mandate off their backs. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Foley. Senator Chambers, followed by Senator Maxwell.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, those people who call themselves pro-life seem to have a difficult time stating the truth. They know how to shade it, they know how to mislead, they know how to misrepresent. I'd like to ask Senator Foley a question, because he made a comment
