SENATOR FOLEY: I honestly don't know, Senator. It was an abortion-related bill. I...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. That's enough.

SENATOR FOLEY: All I know is that you voted yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, LB 38 was a rewrite of the criminal code. That code was given to the Judiciary Committee to rewrite. There were many things in it that I objected to, and my yes vote was not for this language, as Senator Foley would mislead you into believing. This was not a freestanding piece of legislation. It was a part of the criminal code. Check and see what LB 38 was. And Senator Foley and I went through this in the past. But let's say that I had voted yes for it as a freestanding piece of legislation. It would simply mean that the passage of 25 years made me wiser than I was at that time. This language that I read for you talked about a legislative intrusion by the Supreme Court, and so forth. And I said, in those two lines, or three, whatever they were, was silliness and claptrap and the rest of what I said. Senator Foley has not touched what I referred to directly in condemning it. That's like Julie Schmit-Albin, a felon--dishonesty was the crime she was involved with, but their self-righteousness is going to be held up as the reason we ought to listen to them and believe what they say. I have never tried to misrepresent Senator Foley or anybody else on this floor. That is an out-and-out misrepresentation when he tries to suggest that I supported this legislation. Down through the years, I have attacked this kind of legislation, this kind of language that exists in the law now. And when I would attack it, the people who supported it would say, well, that's already in the law. And I'd say, yes, but it shouldn't be, it should never have been there. But that having been taken care of, let me say that I really appreciate Senator Landis' presentation. He dealt with some bedrock issues that are generally ignored when these types of abortion bills come before us. And this is an anti-abortion bill; there's no question about it. Nobody has come in here with a stack of letters that any school board or
