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FLOOR DEBATE

January 12, 2004 LB 172

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...under and pursuant to the rules. This motion is allowed under the rules. Additional work can be done on this piece of legislation on the floor, or it can be done in committee. As a practical, experienced politician, I know this vote will not prevail, as far as I'm concerned. I know this bill will not be recommitted to committee. But it's a motion which can be made that makes possible additional discussion. And I have other motions I'm going to make. I even have some amendments I would offer to the existing law. We will see how things develop on that score. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Chambers. You've heard the closing. The question before the body is the motion to recommit LB 172 to committee. Excuse me. Senator Chambers?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I would ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote.

SPEAKER BROMM: A call of the house has been requested. All in favor of the house going under call please vote aye, and opposed nay. Please record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, to place the house under call.

SPEAKER BROMM: The house is under call. Members, please report to the Chamber. Unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. The house is under call. Senator Synowiecki and Senator Bourne, the house is under call. A roll call vote has been requested. Is that right, Senator Chambers?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, if you please.

SPEAKER BROMM: A roll call vote has been requested. All unexcused members are present. Mr. Clerk. The question before us, once again, is the motion to recommit LB 172 to committee. Mr. Clerk.
