SENATOR SCHIMEK: Right. And I don't know it's the perfect answer. There's others floating out there. All I'm...all I was trying to do with Senator Foley was getting to say that he would support anything else, and I don't get that feeling from him at all.

SENATOR BOURNE: Right.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: So maybe there's no point in pursuing it.

SENATOR BOURNE: I don't know what to suggest, Senator Schimek. Maybe you want to do an amendment on something like this. I mean it kind of makes some sense to me.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: It is being drafted.

SENATOR BOURNE: My whole position here is that, you know, we've already spent, since 9:00 this morning in a short session on an issue that I'm not...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BOURNE: ...I mean, I'm not at all saying it's insignificant. This is very important. However, in the interests of efficiency of time and that, maybe it makes some sense to compromise, and I'd throw that out to Senator Foley. I do appreciate Senator Schimek discussing this and offering that up. With the remainder...do I...how much time do I have, Mr. President?

SENATOR CUDABACK: About 45 seconds, Senator Bourne.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bourne. Senator Landis, reconsideration motion.

SENATOR LANDIS: Oh, I'm sorry. I'll pass.
