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the boards, as far as I'm concerned, because if we don't pass a single bill, the world is not going to come to an end. Everything we don't do this session will be here next session. If there are arrangements that can be made, I would consider them. My mind is not closed on the issue. My mind is closed against the green copy of the bill as it stands now. In order for that proposal that Senator Schimek mentioned to you to have made it to Select File, it's obvious that I didn't oppose it. So I'm willing to listen, but I'm not going to go along with nonsense. I will listen to the nonsense because when people stand on the floor I pay attention. Sometimes inadvertently somebody will say something that has great value and significance to me, maybe more significance to me than it did to the one who stated it, because when I give it back they don't remember having said it, but it made an impression on my mind and I thought it was worthy of retaining for future reference. Senator Landis made a lot of those statements this morning in his earlier presentation.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And I read to you some words which I don't think people paid attention to, where the Legislature encourages prosecutors to bring charges against parents who sexually and otherwise abuse their children. That is a recognition by the Legislature of what Senator Landis pointed out; namely, that those who are called parents do not always have the best interests of their children at heart. The Legislature acknowledged that by asking that prosecutors bring these charges. The reason the Legislature cannot mandate it is because one of the essentials of a prosecutor's office is discretion. So all that the Legislature could do is recommend strongly, as it did, that when these acts of incest and other types of abuse occur, that prosecution take place. If this child, who's going to have a baby because she was impregnated by her daddy, has to go to the daddy, that's sending the lamb to the wolf. It ought to be a sin to force...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...a baby to have a baby.
