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happen. The people out here in this country don't count. I didn't see any pro-lifers running to do anything about that. I don't see them ever speaking out on any issue except those that affect fetuses. Even a couple of bills that Senator Foley has this session where he talks about being able to bring a civil action on behalf of a fetus that was injured in an assault, you know what they do systematically? They demean, degrade women. They play down the value of women. And the thing that is so tragic, they get women to go along with this notion. Men are the ones who come up with these crackbrained ideas. I have stated many times that if a pregnant woman were attacked in any way, I would be in favor of making that an aggravated whatever kind of attack it was, but it should be an attack against the woman and not trying to elevate the fetus above the woman, and that's what Senator Foley and his ilk are interested in doing. They always do that. A comment in the newspaper misstated my position. It said that I don't believe that human life exists until birth. What I say is that a human being does not come into existence until birth. Any time there is a living something, that is life. There are viruses and bacterial within a human being which are alive. But some people are not careful in how they state things. That's why I like to give my position myself. Nobody can persuade me that a human being exists when a sperm fertilizes an egg--preposterous and silly. What you have is not even as big as a period in this law book, and a homicide can be committed against that. They are so far out in left field that it's hard to take seriously anything they say. They have lost touch with reality. But when people get blinded by dogmas, they cannot reason.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. I had made some comments about Bishop Bruskewitz down here, and Senator Foley and others were outraged. And Bruskewitz himself wrote some negative things about me in his paper, and then we find out that he's out of step with what the bishop said ought to be done about priests abusing sexually little boys. And I don't hear Senator Foley saying anything about that. In fact, before the issue broke, and I brought it up, he said what I said was vile. But it was true. It was true, and it still is true.
