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depending on the people that are living in the area and what they think needs to be put on these information sheets, so they've probably worked around it, worked around laws that the government has been slow to come up with or rules that government has put on them that they really didn't need to start with. I think, as Senator Chambers has mentioned about...keeps mentioning about the Mad Cow disease and the downer cows, well, in Nebraska, we haven't been able to sell downer cows or...for several years now. So you don't have to worry about Nebraska beef because if a cow can't walk through the sale barn or can't walk through a packinghouse, it doesn't go. So that part is the people in Nebraska have been way ahead of the federal government about four years out. I think this is the type of stuff in LB 172 that it's probably something that didn't need to be here to start with. We've spent a great deal of time today discussing what it is. I don't feel whether it's of pro-choice or pro-life, whichever way you want to look at it. I think it's a social issue. I think it should be taken care of on a social nature and by other regulations. Senator Landis painted some various pictures and every one of them was against the law; that there are other ways to deal with those situations that he mentioned. So I think we probably just as well get on with this LB 172. I don't see where it helps anybody because I think the schools are going to work around it to suit themselves anyway. So myself, I think it's something that we probably didn't need to have to start with. Thank you, Senator Foley. I'll return any of my time left to Senator Foley.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Louden. Senator Foley, you have about a minute and a half.

SENATOR FOLEY: Thank you very much, Senator Louden, for the time. You're absolutely correct. This is all about social engineering and using the schools to try to communicate messages. That's not where the schools want to be. They've told us that over and over again. They want to focus on their core mission, which is educating our children. That's their core mission and we hold them accountable for that. We shouldn't be abusing and misusing the stature and prestige of the public school system to try to carry...
