and neutrals, I want to tell you that they utilized the line of reasoning that I used, and even quoted from my comments on the floor. So I know what I'm talking about, even though my colleagues disagree. And they are motivated by religion, dogma, and emotion. And they do things because they have the votes. But fortunately, in this system, there is a way to correct the emotional errors committed by the vast majority of members of a particular legislature. Sometimes people will stand on this floor when they have one of these cockamamie notions and say, why is Nebraska the only state that doesn't do this or that? And I point out, it's because no other states have somebody like me in their legislature who will winnow out this craziness, so like a virus it perpetuates itself, it grows, it goes on and on and on, infecting every state. But I will fight against those things here. And this is one of those things I intend to fight against. Senator Foley has to keep bringing these notions about, what else can you do that involves a fetus, because they cannot attack a woman's right to have an abortion. But they've got to try to keep the issue alive. Schmit-Albin and her ilk need to have something they can use to raise money so they'll have a job, if they're paid. They've got to have an issue. But that doesn't mean that the Legislature needs to docilely go along. I realize that my colleagues can be intimidated, they can be bullied, they can be buffaloed into voting for things they don't agree with. How do I know that? Because some of you have told me. So we are aware of what is afoot here. Senator Foley knows he doesn't have to give logical or reasonable arguments. He knows that this is an abortion issue for him and his ilk. He acknowledged it. But when you begin scraping the bottom of the barrel, that's when you come up with these kind of arcane, in my way of thinking, asinine notions. They talk about being concerned about young women's welfare. Then why not give these young women information they need to make decisions that are in their welfare, in their best behalf, and for their welfare? Why don't we give them that information? Because there is really not any concern for women. If anything, there's a type of hatred and contempt for women inherent in all of this anti-abortion legislation. Other people want to dictate to women. In all of the history, in all of the religions that Christians and white people from America, England, and Europe have had anything to do with, women have been cast low, and men
