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SPEAKER BRONN PRESIDING

SPEAKER BRONN: Senator Foley, will you yield?

SENATOR FOLEY: Yes, I will.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Foley, first of all, I want to be sure that I understand and will not misrepresent anything that you've said.

SENATOR FOLEY: Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You said that if this bill were in effect, that no school is prohibited from providing this information. Now, here is my question. Do you believe that schools that are currently providing this information would continue to do so in the way they're doing it now? And I'm just asking for your opinion.

SENATOR FOLEY: My honest answer, Senator, is I think that many of the schools, perhaps most, maybe even all, would probably just stop passing out that form.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. And I agree, Senator Foley. And I knew you would give a direct answer. And members, that's what those of us who oppose Senator Foley's bill are well aware of. Others are aware of it, too. This information is of value. Now, I don't know what point Senator Foley is going to ask 32 of his colleagues to join him in ending the discussion. But until he does so, there are some items...

SPEAKER BRONN: One minute.
