SENATOR FOLEY: Yes.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes. Senator Foley, I don't think this is your priority bill, is it? Or is it?

SENATOR FOLEY: It is a Speaker priority bill.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay. And I don't know if it is kosher to ask you this or not, but I'm going to ask you, because I heard it on public radio this morning, and I would like to know. Do you really intend to call a cloture vote this morning?

SENATOR FOLEY: Well, I...you know, I don't know how many hours of debate the body really needs to spend on any particular bill, but I heard a lot yesterday afternoon about Mad Cow disease and BSE and so forth, and at some point, you've just got to say, I think this debate really is over. And I kind of got...I'm kind of reaching that point where I just kind of feel like we have beaten this thing to death. And you know, you even weighed in on the Mad Cow disease yesterday afternoon. Why you did that, I don't know. But...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: It was momentary, really.

SENATOR FOLEY: ...that's your prerogative as a senator.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: It was a momentary weighing in.

SENATOR FOLEY: Well, it's your prerogative as a Senator. I don't dispute that.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Well, Senator, I guess what I'm saying to you is, I would like a chance to discuss some of those issues and see if there's any common ground. And I asked you briefly yesterday to consider the Bohlke bill of several years ago, if there was any way we could work with that. And I don't really have a solid response back from you on it, but I did see you go out to the lobby, and then you came back, and I never heard anything more about it.
