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SENATOR FOLEY: Well, what I hear and see in the Bohlke amendment is we're going to set up an 800 abortion hot line for 12-year-old children. I can't get too excited about that, quite frankly.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: So you don't think these children who are in a situation where they're already pregnant should have any information at all...

SENATOR FOLEY: You know...Senator, you...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...about the parental notification...

SENATOR FOLEY: ...you know darn well...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...that's required?

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR FOLEY: Senator, you know clear well that I have never, never said anything about trying to deny information. This is all about whether or not we're going to require the public schools, force them, to distribute information. That's...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay, okay. But how is a 12-year-old girl...

SENATOR FOLEY: ...what this issue is about.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...supposed to get information?

SENATOR FOLEY: Senator Schimek, these kids are being bombarded with all kinds of messages. I...you know,...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: But from whom?

SENATOR FOLEY: ...with all due respect to you, I've got a daughter that's pretty close to age 12; she's 11 and a half. These kids are getting bombarded with all kinds of stuff. And to say...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: But where are they getting it from, Senator?
