There are a lot of people in this state, hunting, trapping is not such a big thing anymore, and fishing is a big part of Nebraska. It's been a rural state and that's been a rural thing, but there's a lot of city people, too, and urban people who put a lot of money into these sports. That's why I'm going to support it and I hope you will too. Thank you.
