SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Are they...what are they?

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: Good food.

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: As much as I can, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And do you want to keep the deer from seeing you?

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Does the deer have a weapon with which it could shoot you?

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Would you consider it a sport if you had a gun and I had a gun and we were hunting each other?
