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FLOOR DEBATE

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SENATOR SCHROCK: No, I think what Game and Parks does now is reasonable. I foresee what they plan on doing in the future is reasonable, and so I don't think this would curtail their activities or impede them in any way in what they're doing at the present time.

SENATOR BEUTLER: And do you envision this law as affecting landowners' rights in any way whatsoever?

SENATOR SCHROCK: I don't believe it would, Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: You don't intend it to.

SENATOR SCHROCK: No.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SENATOR SCHROCK: And I think landowners respect the species of mammals and birds...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHROCK: ...that are not to be hunted. I think we respect that.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. We have a lot of laws with regard to hunting and trapping and fishing that have to do with cruelty to animals and doing things in a way that is most respectful of the pain and trauma caused to an animal. Would you expect that this provision would have any negative effect on the judgment of the Game and Parks Commission with respect to that item?

SENATOR SCHROCK: No, I would not.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Thank you very much.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Vrtiska, the Chambers amendment.
