I think the trappers should be trapped. I think the anglers should be fished for. Give them a taste of what they're dishing out. But let me say something serious about what Senator Schrock brought up about this so-called mountain lion problem in California. I'll introduce it by talking about something I say on CNN this morning where some man was told by God to jump into a lion's enclosure, and he did what God told him to do. (Laugh) It was...must have been the God of the lions. Because the lion didn't really hurt him. He just kind of knelt over him and popped him around and chewed on him a little bit, but he never did grab him by the throat and strangle him, as they do when they're killing prey. And he didn't disembowel him. He just said to himself, look what has been delivered into my paws, and he could think of all the things that these people, like Senator Schrock and Senator Stuhr and all you-all's ancestors have done to the animals, and just kind of tapped him up a little bit. Then somebody fired some warning shots, and the lion said, okay, game is over, and let him go, and the guy scurried right out of the lion's enclosure. When animals attack human beings, it's because human beings have encroached on the domain or the territory of those animals. They are taking away the habitat of animals, and as Khrushchev said, when he was explaining to Americans why Francis Gary Powers did not bite into the cyanide capsule and kill himself, Khrushchev said, living things want to go on living. The smallest bacterium, if you put a toxic or harsh substance near it, will try to escape. So when human beings encroach on the habitat of these animals, the animals are going to first resort to flight. But when they have no place else to run, they are given no choice. When people in Florida build houses with swimming pools near to where alligators live, and those alligators wind up in the pool, they treat the alligator like it did something wrong, instead of taking the human being and putting him or her in one of those jackets that has sleeves that tie up in the back and no buttons. These people who were attacked by these mountain lions go where the animals are, and the first person that had been killed by the lion that I'm sure Senator Schrock is talking about put himself in a position where he would be mistaken for prey. He knelt down and was fixing his bicycle, and the experts say that when that posture is assumed or lying down or prone, it's a sign of weakness and an invitation to an attack. So the animal, acting
