That's what I'm interested in doing--protecting the constitution from frivolous amendments. My amendment needs some amending of its own. As I've listened to the discussion, I need to add "or silly" to my amendment. See, brothers and sisters, I can be taught by my colleagues. If the sluggard can go to the little, bitty ant who has six legs and six little feet and learn something, I can learn from my colleagues who have two legs and two big feet, if I just pay attention, try hard enough, and dig deep enough. As we proceed with this discussion, there are other items I'm going to talk about that I feel are of great importance, and it would be good if we could give our attention to them. Some will be beyond our power as a State Legislature to address, but they will be offered as amendments to show the types of things that would be more appropriate for us to deal with. And I have a group of amendments that I intend to pursue. As I look around the Chamber and see people leaving, I will not leave when other people's bills come up. I assure you all I'm going to stay around here and I'm going to talk on your bills too. Oh, I'm not going to play favorites. I'm not going to ignore you. When my good friend Senator Friend, who loves General Patton, stands up and says, now I don't remember exactly where this...I saw this, it was a movie and I'm not sure this is what General Patton...well, maybe I should...well, but let me say it;...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...General Patton said that there's something about war that he just loves. Well, there's something about the Legislature and the battling that I love. Senator Friend didn't know I pay attention to him, that I mark well what he says, and I wasn't speaking of Mark Quandahl, who's standing over there. But if Senator Friend brings a bill and it comes out to the floor, I'm going to spend as much time talking about his bill as I do anybody else's. Even though he's a new senator, I think I owe that to him. Thank you, Mr. President.
