SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR FRIEND: Why shouldn't Senator Schrock receive the same respect on this floor as far as hunting and fishing are concerned that you receive as far as the constitution, from a person like me and some of the other people out on this floor? I respect your constitutional ability.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I have...

SENATOR FRIEND: Why can't he receive the respect as far as hunting and fishing are concerned?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: There are federal cases, one all the way to the U.S. Supreme Court, state cases, legislation I have drafted, which establish my credentials. Senator Schrock has brought us nothing to establish his credentials as an expert on hunting. Nothing. He has not brought us the head of a deer, has not brought us the pelt of a pussycat, has not brought us the tail of a puppy dog, nothing to suggest that he's an expert on hunting.

SENATOR FRIEND: Well, I'm not sure that when you...I am taking on face value. I haven't seen the things that you're talking about in regard to you being a constitutional expert. I haven't seen that. I'd love to see it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But I...

SENATOR FRIEND: I'm taking your word for it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, but here's the thing,...

SENATOR FRIEND: Do you believe what Senator Schrock says 50 percent of the time out on this floor?
