SENATOR HARTNETT: One minute,...

SENATOR HARTNETT: ...one minute, Senator Chambers. One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. That's all I will ask you, Senator Friend. I've got more amendments coming up, so we'll have the opportunity. But I've got to make it clear what my amendment says. This is a tack-on to my main amendment. The main one is to be able to hunt for ways to protect the constitution from frivolous amendments. I'm adding "and silly." So the words I'm asking you to vote to adopt are the two words "and silly." Mr. President, I would ask for a call of the house, and also that you direct our members to stay in their seats while I'm talking. (Laugh)

CLERK: 18 ayes, 1 nay to place the house under call, Mr. President.
