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they'll laugh at this and mock it. Senator Combs demonstrated the sense of humor that I've come to appreciate in her with her last comments about the Martians. But she made a comment that I can't let pass. She mentioned about six other states which are loony, and says Nebraska should join them. Six states, in their looniness, ought to be the examples for Nebraska. But she said that proves this is not being done in a vacuum. What it proves is that the people supporting it have a vacuum between their ears. And nature abhors a vacuum, so I'm trying to pour some knowledge and information in there, so you all won't be so terrified. Here's what I will promise you to do. When one of these mysterious, amorphous groups that have you all so terrified comes into your community, or if you think they're in your community, call me. You've seen the movie Ghostbusters. Who you gonna call? Ghostbusters. Well, when you see these fearsome forces, Senator Schrock, call me. I'll be there. I will rescue you. I will save you. And we won't have to worry about these kind of things coming anymore. Senator Combs pointed out that there are 42 (sic) words in this proposal, as if the number of words mitigates the harm. Senator Combs, there are two words I can think of which have caused more heartache and pain in this society than any other two words I can think of. Those two words are "I do." (Laughter) Just two words,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...and they create a relationship which can only end in one of two ways--death or divorce. "I do." But I don't support this proposal. And since Senator Schrock is going to offer a bracket motion, despite the provocative comments that my paranoid comments...colleagues may make, I will try, as hard as I can, not to say anything else. But if they provoke me too severely, I will have no choice other than to respond. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Mr. President, members. And thank you, Senator Schrock, for allowing some discussion here before the bracket motion is taken up. But my position on this issue has somewhat evolved from the beginning. I didn't think it was
