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SENATOR FOLEY: That's fine.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: ...to begin?

SENATOR FOLEY: I'll put mine on again, and we'll just continue this.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: All right.

SENATOR FOLEY: Yeah.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Well, this is going to run some length.

SENATOR FOLEY: Please.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Okay. I'm respectfully opposed to your floor amendment, FA1403, which is pending, as I was to...I was...the one you showed me yesterday. Since you referenced it, I'll handle that. That one had a circuitry problem, a circular argument problem that I've laid out for you earlier this morning off the floor. The reason that I am opposed to your pending amendment is twofold. First of all, the amendment is flawed. If we were going to amend the pending AM2019 to accomplish that which you seek to do, you would have to draft it differently than this floor amendment is drafted. I will just leave it at that, to not be overly technical.

SENATOR FOLEY: That's...very good.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: It's just not. So we would have a flawed...in a bill in which we're trying to cure two flawed laws, we would flaw our law.

SENATOR FOLEY: Okay.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: And so I think that's an example of what happens sometimes when we can't engage in enough of the process thoughtfully to do the research and get it done. So I'm opposed to the amendment because it's flawed, even to accomplish your purpose.
